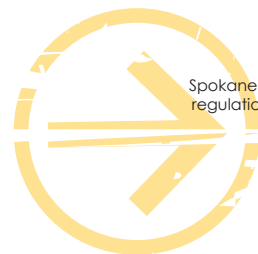

### **Contract Based Education**

This option is designed for the self-motivated and independent learner. Students meet several times a week with a certified teacher who makes assignments for students to complete on their own. Beyond the teacher-contact time, students are expected to complete about 20 additional hours of homework each week. This program is often a resource for students who are parents, have health conditions, or need to be employed.

### **The Community School**

This 9-12th grade school located on the Havermale campus offers a student-centered, experiential approach. Project Based Learning allows a personalized, authentic approach to education that links students to our community and the world at large. ### **On-Track Academy**

Designed for 11th and 12th graders who are behind in credits, On-Track helps students complete required credits to graduate on time. This is an individualized program that includes Skills Center classes and community internships. Students complete authentic projects with deep investigations, research projects and exhibitions of learning. ### **Skills Center**

The Spokane Skills Center serves students in grades 11 and 12 who are bused to and from their high school. Students earn elective credit in medical, dental and automotive careers, broadcasting, construction, culinary arts, pre-law enforcement, fire science, hospitality, manufacturing (welding), technology (programming, web design, game design and graphics) and veterinary science.
