Principal's Corner

Logan Community,

With the state reducing class size in grades K-3 and with increasing enrollment in many parts of Spokane, 6th grades will be shifting out of the elementary schools and into middle schools. This will happen beginning in the Fall of 2022 for students living in north Spokane and in the Fall of 2023 for those living in south Spokane.

These changes have led to a need to adjust attendance boundaries for schools, something Spokane Public Schools (SPS) has not done in over 40 years.

A boundary adjustment committee made up of over 50 community members and SPS staff members has created a series of recommendations for the School Board to consider.

The proposed boundaries do not impact Logan's attendance boundary at all, however, there are proposed changes to where Logan scholars will attend middle school and high school.

The School Board would like community input on the proposed changes and has set up a series of online community forums. The forums for north side schools take place tonight (April 15) and on Monday (April 19) at 6:30pm. You are invited to attend either one.

Notice: Pesticide Application April 16!

Logan's annual dormant oil spray will be applied to the trees and shrubs on April 16. This spray application consists of one gallon of mineral oil mixed in 80 gallons of water to cover and kill dormant insect eggs that over winter in our area. A weed and grass control spray will be applied to the shrub beds and mowing strips at on the same day. This spray is to control unwanted grass and weeds in the shrub beds, around the trees and along the street curb areas.

Our school has taken steps to keep school children away from these areas for 24 hours following the application of spray. We ask that you and your children refrain from making contact with or playing around the trees and shrubs our school during that same time. A variation from this schedule may occur as a result of inclement weather.
