
Principal's Corner

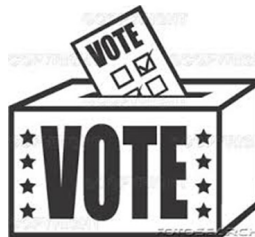

SPS Maintenance and Operation Levy on February 9 Ballot

Logan families and community members may have heard about a replacement levy that is coming up in February. Here a few facts:



- School levies support essential programs, staff and services that provide a quality education for our students.
- The levy is a way for the Spokane community to provide a well-rounded education for SPS students.
- The 2021 levy replaces the expiring 2018 levy and is not a new tax.
- The total estimated tax rate for schools will be less than in 2018 and prior years.

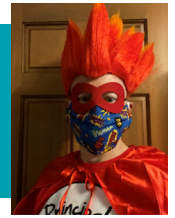

Hey there COVID Cadets! Captain COVID here, and today I'd like to talk with you about how to eat with a mask on. You know why? Because you could wear a mask all day long, but if everyone's mask is off while they eat, all that mask wearing would be for nothing because germs could be passed around in the air while we chew and talk.

Here are the steps. Practice this at home with your brothers and sisters and the grownups in your house! The steps below are for a person who eats with their right hand. For those lefties out there, reverse the process!

• Step 1- With your mask on,

use your left hand to grab the ear strap over your right ear. Touching the mask here lessens the chance that you will touch a part of the mask that has germs on it.

• Step 2- Pull the mask off of the right ear while the left ear loop stays on and swing the mask open to take a bite.

• And Step 3- Cover your mouth with your mask while you chew. You can either hold the mask over your mouth while you chew or put the loop back over your right ear.
