As a federally funded, Title I-Part A school, Logan receives additional resources to improve student learning. Title I funds help hire additional instructional intervention staff, instructional coaches that help classroom teachers grow and counseling staff to support young scholars. Funds also purchase additional instructional materials, provide professional development for staff and engage families and the community in opportunities to support scholars at home.

We invite you to continue to find ways to partner with us in your Logan scholar's education. One such way is to provide input on our Title I Family Engagement Plan, our Title I Parent Compact and our School Improvement Plan. 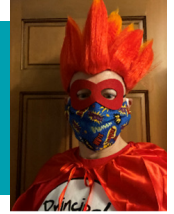

4. Repeat steps 1-3 for each bite.
