I wanted to get the New Year started by highlighting a program Logan has in place for students in grades 4-6, with 3rd grade coming on board later in the year. Logan's Pride Pass program, which has been in place for a little over a year now, awards students who consistently meet schoolwide ROAR expectations (**R**espect **O**thers, **O**vercome Problems, **A**ct Safely, be **R**esponsible).


Students who meet the requirements are role models for the Lion community, and need little, if any, adult support to be positive, contributing members of our learning community. For their efforts, Pride Pass students receive extra privileges and attend celebrations throughout the year. Privileges range from having their own individual hall passes to leaving early for specialist classes and lunch. Celebrations have ranged from Bingo parties and kickball games to special treats and computer lab time.

Students who meet the following expectations and fill out an application can earn a Pride Pass:

- All work completed with pride
- No office referrals
- Meeting Independent reading goals
- No unexcused absences
- 1 tardy or less; no unexcused tardies
- Participating in a school activity or volunteering
- 2s/3s in AVID binder checks
- Character test

If you have a student in grades 4, 5 or 6, encourage them to apply. And if your child is not yet meeting the requirements to apply, perhaps Pride Pass could be a New Year's resolution!

Keeping Kids Safe in Cars

A new law went into effect in Washington State January 1st, that will help keep kids safer while riding in cars. Children must remain in a properly installed rear-facing car seat until age 2, a five-point harness until age 4 and a booster seat until they are 4 feet, 9 inches tall or 13 years old, whichever comes first. So many Logan Lions will need to be in some type of car seat or booster throughout their schooling here.

The fine for not properly restraining a child is \$139.

Of the 675 children under 12 who died in vehicle accidents in 2017, 35% of them were not buckled in. And improper car seat installation is common, with 59% of car seats and 20% of booster seats installed incorrectly according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
