Free Food for All Logan Students

Whether your child has hot lunch or brings a lunch from home, there are free opportunities for all.

With Logan's new Community Eligibility Provision, every child receives free breakfast and lunch, regardless of a family's ability to pay. Students are required by federal school lunch guidelines to select a minimum of three items from the lunch line, with at least one item a fruit or vegetable. And with our fruit/vegetable bar, there are always many options to choose from!

Families who send cold lunches also have free access to portions of the meal if interested. Like mentioned above, three items must be selected. Logan is not allowed to give free milk, however, if the student selects two other items off of the line, with at least one being a fruit or vegetable, the milk is free.

Logan has had a Scratch Cooking Kitchen since the fall of 2015. So the food is good, and the health benefits are even better!
