Safety tips for student drop off and pick up

The 10 minutes right before and after school can be quite a challenge. Busy and congested may be inconvenient, but it doesn't have to be unsafe. Please do your part to keep our students, staff, and other parents out of harm's way.

- ✓ **Park and walk. Avoid the chaos!** Park down the block and walk with your student. It's safer and healthier. If you park across the street, take the time to walk with your young student(s), and show them how to use the crosswalk correctly.
- ✓ **Park only in designated areas.** Parking inappropriately or in a No Parking zone puts students and other drivers at risk.
- ✓ **Watch for and follow crossing guard instructions.** Help them keep our students safe!
- ✓ **Use curbside arrival/departure:** Have your student(s) exit the vehicle at the curb, not into or across traffic.
- ✓ **Slow down!** We get it. It's been a hectic day. But the school zone is where you need to slow down and practice patience.

Please do NOT:

- ✗ **Park in bus areas.** While this may seem convenient, it creates all kinds of student safety issues.
- ✗ **Drive in the wrong direction or make U-turns.** Besides being illegal, these actions put students and other drivers in danger.
- ✗ **Block crosswalks, sidewalks, or driveways.** This forces students and others to walk around your vehicle into traffic. It also makes neighbors mad.
- ✗ **Use your phone.** Distracted driving puts everyone in danger.
- ✗ **Back up in school zones.** This can be extremely dangerous in areas with many younger students.

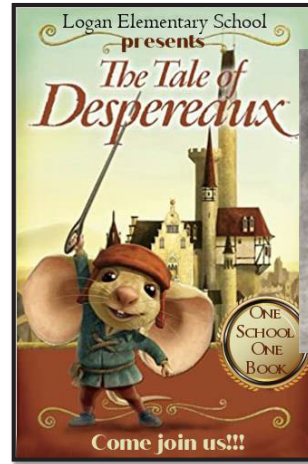
March Reading Family Literacy Event

Please set aside time to read with your family each night!

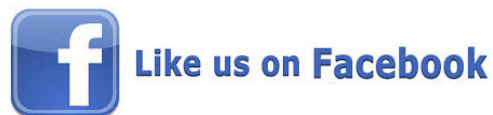

Dear Logan Families,

Our staff is very excited to meet and engage with each of our families during the March 29-April 2 Parent-Teacher Conference Week. Please use the link below to go online to get signed up for your child's conference.

Using this link, you will have the opportunity to schedule each of your elementary-aged students at one time.

Please call our school office at 354-2400 if:

- None of the available dates/times work for you. Your child's teacher can also be contacted to help with this as well.
- You have any difficulty signing up online.

ELD students who need translation services will be noted and the ELD Department will try to provide a translator, but many conferences will be using language line translation services instead.

Once you have completed scheduling your student's conference:

- You will receive a confirmation email, including calendar reminders for Google Calendar or Outlook that can be added to your computer or smartphone.
- Your student's teacher will then send a Microsoft Teams meeting link to your email for your conference to be held virtually, unless you have arranged a different method (phone or in-person) with your student's teacher.
- If you do not hear back from your child's teacher by early next week, please call our school office at 354-2400 so we can get you connected with the teacher.

Parent-Teacher conferences are very important to allow time to talk about your child's progress, strengths, and next steps in learning and are also a good time for you to ask questions and set goals together to benefit your child as they finish up this school year.

Please note: To ensure that we are following all the state and district safety requirements and protocols, all staff, parents, and students entering district schools for parent-teacher conferences are required to wear face masks, use hand sanitizer, use social distancing, and check in at the school office.

Most conferences are being conducted virtually, but if you have arranged for an in-person conference with your child's teacher, please first check in at the office upon arriving at the school.
