The pandemic forced 1st graders in Ms. Slater's classroom into the hallway to keep their social distancing as they hopped up and down the number line!

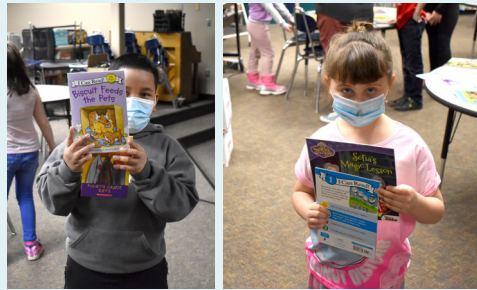

March Reading

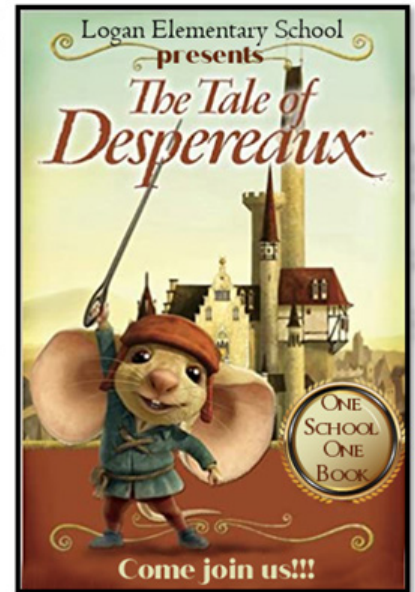
Family Literacy Event
