The easiest way to complete the health check is through the Spokane Public Schools app, which is available on Google Play and the Apple App Store.

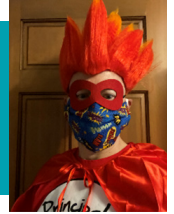

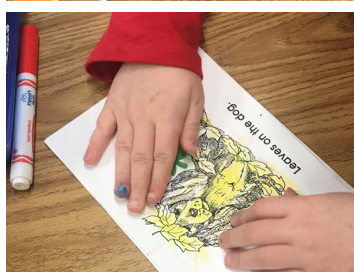
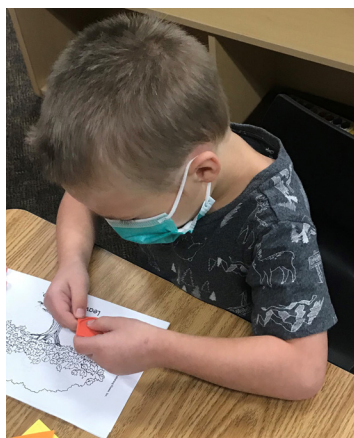
