Did you know that Hispanic Heritage Month starts in the middle of September and continues through the middle of October? Unlike other heritage months that are recognized and celebrated, beginning with the first day of a selected month, Hispanic Heritage Month starts on September 15th. It continues for 30 days to the middle of October. You may be asking yourself why that would be? Well, let's find out!

September 15th is the date that several Latin American countries celebrate as their Independence Day, including Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala and Nicaragua.

Recognition of Hispanic heritage started in the United States in 1968 when President Lyndon B. Johnson signed a a bill designating the week of September 15th as National Hispanic Heritage Week. Then, 20 years later, the week was lengthened to an entire month under President Ronald Reagan.

On Friday, October 1st, Our Librarian, Mrs. Adame, hosted a Hispanic Heritage Celebration. Mrs. Zamora, our ELD teacher, Ally Barrera, our SPS communications specialist, and I shared our heritage with the sixth graders. 


