Greetings Logan families and community!

Yesterday saw the first day of in-person instruction for cohort A of our kindergarten class. Today, cohort B is at Logan having their first day of in-person instruction.

And while our preschoolers started a couple weeks ago due to their unique learning needs, the return of kindergarten marks the beginning of a transitioning period for all students to return to school.

Spokane Public Schools has committed to follow the recommendations of the Spokane Regional Health District and will continue to do so to protect your scholar, your family and your school staff.

I recognize that there are those who would like to see us wait to return to any in-person instruction until infection rates are lower, and those who would like all scholars to return at once. Know that if it were deemed safe to do so, we would certainly bring all students back. But for now, we will move slowly and carefully, and continue to follow the guidance of the public health officials whose expertise far surpasses my own on the subject.

For those families whose lions continue to learn online, I commend you for your ongoing commitment to your children and their online learning. This is hard. It is hard for teachers, hard for scholars and hard for parents. Hang in there. We will get through this together!



Families may be wondering what will happen when a student presents symptoms of illness while at school, that may be related to COVID-19. The process outlined below is in place in all Spokane Public Schools locations.

First, let's look at what symptoms will lead to a parent being asked to pick up their scholar.

Either of these:

CoughShortness of breath

Or at least two of these:

Fever
Chills
Repeated shaking with chills

Muscle pain
Headache
Sore throat
New loss of taste or smell

If a scholar presents symptoms as detailed above, they will wait in a designated location in the school away from other students until they can be picked up.

The scholar will not be allowed to return to school until we receive one of the following:

• A doctor's note indicating the illness is not COVID-19

• Proof of a COVID-19 test showing the scholar tested negative OR

• It's been 10 days since onset
