

At Jefferson, we expect students to maintain an appearance that is not disruptive to the orderly educational process of the school. The school is the sudents' work place. Just as others dress for their work place, we expect students to do the same.

Here are some reminders of appropriate school attire:

- Shorts or skirts should be no shorter than mid-thigh.
- T-shirts and tops need to be full length, not cropped or showing waistlines.
- Tank top straps need to be wide. Spaghetti strap tops should not be worn to school, unless covered with a sweater or a jacket.
- Sandals need to be safe for place activities and going up and down steps. Flip-flops, other slip-ons and shoes with high heels are not safe for schoool. Students should be able to walk safely on various surfaces indoors and on our grounds, and to run at recess and in PE in their shoes.
- Pajamas and slippers are permitted only on designated special days.
