## Principal's Corner

Dear Jefferson Families,

The tragedy that unfolded at an elementary school in Uvalde, Texas has touched us all. Here at Jefferson, teachers have led age-appropriate conversations about the tragedy if the topic has surfaced in morning meetings and reviewed steps that we take at school to keep them safe. We also practice lock down drills, with different responses based on an outside or inside threat. I am truly saddened that we even have to do this at all.

While exterior doors remain locked at all times, and visitors must be buzzed in through our single point of entry at the main entrance of the school, there is one change we have made recently to our safety protocols, brought about following a morning meeting in one of our sixth-grade classrooms. The classroom sent a trio of scholars to meet with me about our practice of having all students line up on the blacktop before school begins. This practice has left them feeling vulnerable and they requested that we look to having students line up inside.

We have heeded this request and have now begun having students enter the school directly when arriving on campus. Families are asked to help in this regard by ensuring that scholars will not be on campus before 8:20am. They should enter the building through the same door that they exit each day. Each of these doors will remain available for entry until the 8:30am tardy bell rings. Kindergarteners, who have historically lined up by their classroom exterior doors will enter through the southwest doors by the small play structure.

While the sixth graders had many suggestions for helping address gun violence in schools across America, this suggestion was one that we have control over and can act on without outside action by government officials. We can learn a lot from children if we just take the time to listen.
