

Dear Families,

Your child's safety and well-being are a primary concern for all of us. We share your hope that children learn and grow in a safe and secure learning environment. As you may know, Personal Safety is taught each year to students from kindergarten to 6th grade. This

year Personal Safety will be taught in the month of October.

Personal Safety Being Taught in Classrooms between October 10-31

Your child's teacher will be giving a series of short lessons centering on aspects of

Personal Safety. These lessons will include Internet Safety, as well as maintaining safety with strangers and friends, recognizing appropriate and inappropriate touch, saying "No!" to inappropriate touching, and identifying sources of help and support available to children. If you wish to see the Internet Safety information, we encourage you to log on to **www.NetSmartz.org**. There are additional materials for parents as well as follow up materials for students.

If you have questions or would like to preview the Personal Safety curriculum materials, please contact one of our school counselors at 354-3192.

If you have concerns about your child's participation in Personal Safety, you do have the right to have your child "opt out." Please know that your request will be honored without embarrassment to your child. You can opt out by contacting the school office and requesting a Student Exclusion form and returning it to our school office by Oct 7.




Specialist Classes (page 21)

Art

Scholars in Kindergarten through second grade receive art instruction from a specialist for one 45-minute session each week. Visual art is one of the three choices that sixth graders can make. The other choices are band or orchestra. These scholars attend two one-hour sessions per week.

Band and Orchestra

Sixth grade scholars may choose among band, orchestra and visual art for the year. Sessions are 60 minutes in length two times per week and are delivered by specialists that travel between various schools.



All scholars attend Fitness and Health classes twice per week for 30 minutes. Fitness and health is a required part of the curriculum in Washington State, and scholars are required to participate unless they have a doctor's excuse. Families are

asked to take note of the schedule for each child so they will have appropriate clothing to wear for class or for extracurricular sports-related activities. Tennis shoes without black soles are recommended.

Library

Each scholar at Jefferson attends library for 45 minutes each week. In addition to checking out books and learning about library science, Jefferson's library periods have an extra focus on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). Music

Scholars in grades K-5 have two 30-minute sessions each week with a music specialist.
