Greetings Jefferson Community,

Growing up in the Spokane area, I never had a full sense of the history of this place we call home. I learned a little about Native American tribes in school but mostly as background characters in the story of white explorers and settlers who came to lands that were yet unexplored and unclaimed, which does not accurately reflect the truth that indigenous people had lived on the land for thousands of years. Last week, I introduced a tool that allows us to explore which indigenous tribes inhabited an area before colonization. This week, I will visit a

next step in honoring those who came before us.

Here at Jefferson, we are striving to tell the history of the area and our nation from all perspectives, which includes the history of those who were in power, but also of those who faced subjugation and removal as well. We have a moral obligation to tell all our stories.

When we examine all perspectives of the events in our history, it helps us make better decisions in the future to support all people and continue to make Spokane, and our nation, a better place for everyone.

In our effort to recognize the first inhabitants of the Spokane area, we include a land acknowledgment as part of our Jefferson Journal header each week.

What is a land acknowledgment you ask and why are so many businesses, government entities and educational institutions beginning to use them? Land acknowledgements are historically accurate statements that are honest and honoring of indigenous First Nations of North America. They commemorate their historical and ongoing connection to the land we inhabit.

In the graphic above, you will see the land acknowledgement that is included in the Jefferson Journal. It is shared with students each Tuesday morning during morning announcements.


Individual Picture Retakes
