Dear Families of Jefferson Scholars and the Larger Jefferson Community,

I am going to take a quick break from our series on Mindset this week. I'll get back at it next week after celebrating with the community the success of our recent parent/teacher conferences.

It was wonderful to see so many families at Jefferson or joining on-line for our recent conference week. What better way to continue building a partnership between school and home? We always aim for 100% attendance during conference week and understand that this is certainly a high bar, but also a worthy goal to shoot for because of how important one-on-one time with a scholar's teacher is.

During our most recent conference week, Jefferson saw 97.1% of scholars have families attend to discuss their progress.

The breakdown by grade level was as follows:

- Preschool: 100%
- Kindergarten: 98%
- First: 100%
- Second: 98%
- Third: 96%
- Fourth: 98%
- Fifth: 96%
- Sixth: 95%

During launch conferences in August, 96.2% of Jefferson scholars had family join in conferences.

Thank you again to all families who took the time out of their busy schedules to partner with their child's teacher. For those who were unable to attend during the designated week, it is not too late to contact your child's teacher to set up a time to connect about your scholar's progress and set goals for the remainder of the year!

They can start and end the letter generically such as "Dear friend," and "Sincerely, a Jefferson student". Students can also hang a heart for turning in a welcome letter.
