# PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Good day Jefferson community,

With another school shooting in the news, this one in Tennessee, it can make a parent anxious about the safety of their children when they are in school. I want to share our safety protocols with you today so that you are aware of the steps we take in case of an emergency. Monthly drills help us practice various scenarios, so that in the very unlikely event that something was to occur here, our staff and scholars know how to respond to keep themselves and others safe.

Current Jefferson safety protocols can be reviewed **here**. The pages linked here are taken directly from our Jefferson Staff Handbook and include specifics for crisis clipboards that are hung in every office and classroom across the school.

Spokane Public Schools will be shifting to a new system soon, which will see some updates to these practices. For now, know that we have a safety team that meets monthly to review protocols and any safety concerns at Jefferson.

And speaking of safety, you can help us in a number of ways. First, it is essential that all visitors access the school building through our single point of entry at the main office. We work hard to help scholars learn to not open exterior doors for anyone, but it can be difficult for a youngster to ignore an adult who is waving to them to open a door. If they never see adults trying this and never see a peer opening a door for someone, they are more likely to remember that we don't do this at Jefferson.

Next, if needed, reassure your child that events like those that happened in Tennessee are rare and that Jefferson Staff are focused on their safety and have plans in place to respond to emergencies. This <u>resource article from Yale Medicine</u> can also help if your child has anxiety about something they have learned about in the news.


