Principal's Corner

Families,

As we move through May, teachers and staff begin the important process of determining each child's class placement for the upcoming school year. Through a complex process, we will work to create well-balanced classrooms utilizing a number of factors including academic achievement, behavior, ratio of boys to girls, learning style/teaching style, independence, and the need for support services. Long and thoughtful consideration is given to the placement of each child to ensure his/her maximum growth academically and socially.

Because of this need to balance classrooms in terms of all the factors mentioned above, combined with unknowns regarding which teachers will be at a specific grade level come fall, **we cannot honor parent requests for specific teachers**. However, if you feel that your child has unique needs academically or personally or requires special accommodations that should be considered, please describe those needs to me in writing by **Wednesday, May 24th**.

The placement process is often tricky, as our classroom configurations are dependent on the number of students who arrive in the fall. Some students will move into the area, while others will move out. Because of this, it is important to remember that although you will be informed of your child's class placement in middle to late August via postcard from Jefferson, placements are not considered final until the 10th day of school in the fall.

School Attire (p. 20)

At Jefferson, we expect students to maintain an appearance that is not disruptive to the orderly educational process of the school. The school is the students' workplace. Just as others dress for their workplace, we expect students to do the same.

Here are some reminders of appropriate school attire:

- Shorts or skirts should be no shorter than mid-thigh.
- T-shirts and tops need to be full length, not cropped or showing waistlines.
- Tank top straps need to be wide. Spaghetti strap tops should not be worn to school unless covered with a sweater or jacket.
- Sandals need to be safe for play activities and going up and down steps. Flip-flops, other slip-ons and shoes with high heels are not safe for school. Students should be able to walk safely on the various surfaces indoors and on our grounds and to run at recess and in PE in their shoes.
