Greetings Jefferson Community,

May is Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) Heritage Month in the United States. This is arriving late in the month, but I hope you will agree that it is never too! The AAPI community is both diverse and growing, with over 100 languages, and approximately 50 different ethnicities. According to the 2020 Census, there are 24 million citizens in the United States that make up the AAPI community making it 7% of the total US population.

The beginnings of Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month started in the 1970's, but it took over a decade to officially establish it. A celebratory week known as Asian Pacific American Heritage Week was first signed into law in 1978 by President Jimmy Carter. Later, in 1992, President George H.W. Bush signed Asian Pacific American Heritage Month as the law of the land.

PLAYGROUND CLOSED FOR ONE HOUR AFTER SCHOOL EACH DAY
