PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Good day Jefferson families,

In today's Principal's Corner I wanted to speak to you about student safety during pick up and drop off. While our back bus loop is off-limits to drop off for anyone except families whose scholars are in one of our special programs, the front loop is available for everyone. The challenge we are seeing is that drivers are parking in no-parking areas or double parking in order to exit vehicles to meet their young scholars in person. This places other vehicles and children in peril as they navigate around cars that should be parked in the visitor's parking lot or along either 37th Avenue or Manito Boulevard.



I am asking that everyone abide by the signs posted (and shown here). Starting Monday, January 29, we will begin distributing friendly reminders to cars that are improperly parked and if needed, taking down license plate numbers for follow-up. It is my hope that we can work together and avoid the need for that. Thank you for being our partner in safety.




In addition to the launch conferences that take place before scholars are in classrooms in the fall, another set of full-day conferences take place in January. The district is



What is a school levy?

Levies support essential programs, staff, and services that provide students with a quality education.

The 2024 Educational Programs and Operation Levy replaces the expiring 2021 levy.

The levy helps to provide an educational experience that our community has grown to expect to meet student needs by funding extracurricular activities, special education programs, critical health and wellness services, and other student programs and supports.

What is a school bond?

Bonds support buildings – they pay for facility and security improvements. They cannot be used to operate schools and fund programs.

Bonds require 60% approval, and 40% of voters from the prior general election for validation.

What does the 2024 bond do?

- Modernizes and replaces a few older schools and make smaller improvements across the district while keeping the tax bill predictable.
- Continues Spokane Public Schools' proven history of constructing and maintaining durable, well-designed school buildings.
- Protects and maintains the community's investment in school buildings, keeping the district's long-range replacement and modernization plan on course.
