




# PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Good day to each of you,

Last week I shared some data about where Jefferson is on its journey toward returning to pre-pandemic school attendance levels. While we have improved numbers over last year, we are still a long way from the stellar attendance rates that we saw before the pandemic. Given experts see negative impacts on academics and social emotional growth beginning to accelerate after an average of just one missed school day per month, it is



important for us to work together to have all scholars at school, each and every day that they are not too ill to attend.

Let's take a look at a couple incentive programs Jefferson has implemented this year to bring both attention to the importance of being at school each day and reinforce student and family efforts. The first semester saw our Every Day Matters campaign award classrooms that had 90%+ of scholars attend each day. Classrooms were able to add a piece to their "attendance puppy" each time they hit 90% until the entire puppy was built. They could then name their puppy, turn it in to the office for a shout out during morning announcements followed by seeing it proudly displayed in the front hallway. Classes with the highest percentage over the first semester had celebratory parties.

This semester, the puppy project goal increases to a 95% attendance rate to earn a piece of the class puppy. An individual award has also been added. Each classroom has assigned every scholar a number between 1 and 25. During morning announcements, five random numbers are chosen. If the scholar whose number is selected is at school, they earn a PRIDE ticket on the spot. And if they were on time for school, defined as being in
