Salsa Verde

Ingredients:

- 7 tomatillos
- 1 serrano pepper
- 2 jalapeno peppers
- 1/4 of a white onion
- 1 pinch cilantro
- 1 pinch of salt
- 1 pinch of pepper
- 1 tablespoon olive oil



Instructions:

Chop tomatillos, serrano, jalapenos, and onion. Roast chopped ingredients on a pan for 5 minutes (do not put oil in pan). Place roasted ingredients into blender/food processor and blend with cilantro, salt, pepper, and olive oil. Add avocado if desired. Blend until the mixture is consistent. Serve with tortilla chips or on your favorite dish.




Ancient Civilizations

For seven weeks, 6th grade humanities blocks have been learning about ancient civilizations. They spent that time exploring how civilizations began, the cultures they developed, and the consequences of the technology that arose from those cultures. Students discussed the major technological accomplishments of early civilizations and the impact those technologies had on the cultures of the time.

After learning about what makes up civilizations and societies, students developed their own private island society in 5000 B.C. Taking inspiration from the Assyrians, Persians, Babylonians and Phoenicians, students created their own imaginary civilizations that had their own agricultural resources, militaries, arts, laws, religions and currency.

Some groups created artifacts for a gallery walk, some created digital statues of their leaders on apps, some created trading deals with other civilizations being created, others made their islands out of cake!





7th Grade Humanities Update


