All sites serve 5-day meal kits.

July 5th will be observed for the holiday and no meal service on that day.

The intention of the program is to offer one breakfast and one lunch per child per day. If your child is receiving summer meals elsewhere, please limit meal pick up to that site alone for each week.

Children can go to the site closest to their home for free meals. Any child who comes to the site is eligible for meals.
