WHAT this course is about:

This course's goal is to introduce students to a variety of art media including graphite, ink, painting, charcoal, pastels, and clay. This is a great class for students who want to learn the basics of making artwork or to advance their skills in preparation for an advanced art class. Students will demonstrate competency by understanding and executing the following Elements and Principles of Design: Line, Shape, Form, Space, Size, Texture, Color, Value, Balance, Rhythm, Repetition, Unity, Variation, Movement, and Pattern. Students will create and identify these Design Elements in their own work, the work of their peers, and that of historical artworks. Students will critique their own work and that of their peers and will have access to a variety of venues to display their artwork to the public.

Developing art skill can open many doors in the visual arts industry and it's a fun way to gain the required art electives for graduation.

- Learn to draw, paint, and sculpt out of clay
- Learn how to critique and appreciate artwork.
