## NATIONAL DISABILITIES AWARENESS MONTH

- Nearly four million Americans have grown up with severe physical or mental impairments that have slowed their learning, limited their mobility, inhibited their expression, and rendered them dependent on others for care and assistance.
- On February 26, 1987 President Ronald Reagan officially declared
   Proclamation 5613 making March National Disabilities Awareness Month.
- The proclamation called for people to provide understanding, encouragement, and opportunities to help persons with disabilities to lead productive and fulfilling lives.











# Up to adults in the United States have some type of disability (27%)

#### **EXCEPTIONAL STUDENTS**

- Most educators prefer not to use the term handicapped because of its negative implications.
  - You'll more often see terms like exceptionality—this has more positive implications.
- Intellectual. This includes students who have superior intelligence as well as those who are slow to learn.
- Communicative. These students have special learning disabilities or speech or language impairments.
- Sensory. Sensory-grouped students have auditory or visual disabilities.
- Behavioral. These students are emotionally disturbed or socially maladjusted.
- Physical. This includes students with orthopedic or mobility disabilities.
- Multiple. These students have a combination of conditions, such as orthopedically challenged and visually impaired.
- Although statistics are difficult to obtain, it has been estimated that between 10 and 13 percent of the school-age population has exceptionalities. Thus, in an average-size classroom of 25 students, it is conceivable that 3 or 4 individuals will exhibit one or more exceptionalities.

### OUR FERRIS FRIENDS WITH EXCEPTIONALITIES

- Ferris has about 1,700 students.
- Roughly 200 Ferris students have a documented disability.
- Roughly 730 Ferris students have taken an AP class.
- How many more of us have an unseen or undiagnosed disability?
- We don't need "fixing."
- We need to know we matter and that we are accepted by our peers.
