The curriculum needs to be able to align to <a href="the Washington State Social">the Washington State Social</a> Studies Learning Standards that were adopted in September 2019 and encompass the six units determined critical to <a href="the Spokane Public Schools Civics curriculum">the Spokane Public Schools Civics curriculum</a>. The District expects the approved product would be in place for startup of the 2022-23 school year. Field testing starting early the winter of 2022 most likely will be required.

## Elements Required:

- Comprehensive civics curriculum that includes engaging, interactive content on the following topics:
  - Citizenship the Rights, Duties, and Responsibilities of Citizens, and Civic Engagement
  - Foundations of Government The US Constitution and other foundational documents, principles of the Constitution, including popular sovereignty, checks and balances, separation of powers, and federalism, and Constitutional change
  - Institutions of Government The roles, responsibilities, powers, and limits on powers of the three branches of government (Legislative, Executive, Judicial), the bureaucracy, and the presidential election process (the electoral college)
  - State, Local, and Tribal Government The powers and responsibilities of local, state, and tribal governments
  - Political Beliefs, Parties, and Influencing Decision Making Voting Rights & History of Enfranchisement, History of Political Parties, Political Ideologies, Civil Rights, Interest Groups, Lobbying, the Media, Elections/Electoral Process
  - Public Policy Domestic and Foreign Policy, Civic Engagement
- Content that is non-partisan, equitable, culturally responsive, and free of bias –
  perspectives and contributions from members of diverse groups are infused
  substantially, accurately, and respectfully; content is free of generalizations,
  stereotypes, and misrepresentations

- In-chapter vocabulary/glossary and review questions
- Ability to distribute content in print and pdf or online format
- Easily accessible content for teachers and students.
- Ability to keep content up-to-date
- Teacher Resources for Lesson Planning
