BOARD RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE REGISTRATION OF SPOKANE PUBLIC SCHOOLS AS A PARTICIPATING PUBLIC AGENCY WITH NATIONAL INTERGOVERNMENTAL PURCHASING ALLIANCE

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of 28A.335.190 of the Revised Code of Washington, the Board of Directors of Spokane Public Schools must solicit quotations for purchase and lease of supplies, equipment and materials between \$40,000 and \$74,999 and any purchase and lease of supplies, equipment and material over \$75,000 must be competitively bid; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 39.34, Spokane Public Schools may enter into intergovernmental cooperative purchasing agreements with other public agencies in order to allow the parties to said agreement to cooperatively purchase or acquire supplies, equipment, and materials under future contracts and to utilize each other's contracts, as needs arise; and

WHEREAS, National IPA is a purchasing cooperative of governmental agencies that assists public agencies in reducing the cost of purchased goods through pooling the purchasing power of public agencies nationwide; this is accomplished through competitively solicited contracts for quality products through lead public agencies, who are members of National IPA, and who allow participating public agencies to purchase supplies, equipment and materials from the competitively solicited contracts on the terms and conditions set forth in said contracts; and

WHEREAS, Director of Purchasing has recommended to the Board of Directors that Spokane Public Schools register as a participating public agency with National IPA under the terms and conditions set forth in the attached Master Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing Agreement, which is incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, Director of Purchasing has recommended that she be authorized to take such actions as are necessary to register Spokane Public Schools as a participating agency with National IPA;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of Spokane Public Schools as follows:

- (1) Spokane Public Schools shall register as a participating agency with National IPA under the terms and conditions set forth in the attached Master Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing Agreement; and
- (2) The Director of Purchasing is authorized to take such actions as necessary to register Spokane Public Schools as a participating public agency with National IPA Master Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing Agreement for the purposes as cited under RCW 39.34.

MASTER INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT

This agreement is made between certain government agencies that execute a Principal Procurement Agency Certificate ("Principal Procurement Agencies") to be appended and made a part hereof and other public agencies ("Participating Public Agencies") that register electronically with National Intergovernmental Purchasing Alliance Company ("National IPA") or otherwise execute a Participating Public Agency Certificate to be appended and made a part hereof.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, after a competitive bidding and selection process by Principal Procurement Agencies, a number of Suppliers have entered into Master Agreements to provide a variety of goods, products and services based on national volumes (herein "Products");

WHEREAS, Master Agreements are made available by Principal Procurement Agencies through National IPA and provide that Participating Public Agencies may purchase Products on the same terms, conditions and pricing as the Principal Procurement Agency, subject to any applicable local purchasing ordinances and the laws of the State of purchase;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained in this agreement, and of the mutual benefits to result, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. That each party will facilitate the cooperative procurement of Products.
- 2. That the procurement of Products subject to this agreement shall be conducted in accordance with and subject to the relevant statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations that govern each party's procurement practices.
- 3. That the cooperative use of bids obtained by a party to this agreement shall be in accordance with the terms and conditions of the bid, except as modification of those terms and conditions is otherwise allowed or required by applicable law.
- 4. That the Principal Procurement Agencies will make available, upon reasonable request and subject to convenience, information which may assist in improving the procurement of products by the Participating Public Agencies.
- 5. That a procuring party will make timely payments to the Supplier for Products received in accordance with the terms and conditions of the procurement. Payment for Products and inspections and acceptance of Products ordered by the procuring party shall be the exclusive obligation of such procuring party. Disputes between procuring party and Supplier are to be resolved in accord with the law and venue rules of the State of purchase.
- 6. The procuring party shall not use this agreement as a method for obtaining additional concessions or reduced prices for similar products or services.
- 7. The procuring party shall be responsible for the ordering of Products under this agreement. A non-procuring party shall not be liable in any fashion for any violation by a procuring party, and the procuring party shall hold non-procuring party harmless from any liability that may arise from action or inaction of the procuring party.
- 8. This agreement shall remain in effect until termination by a party giving 30 days written notice to the other party. The provisions of paragraphs 5, 6 and 7 hereof shall survive any such termination.
- 9. This agreement shall take effect after execution of the Principal Procurement Agency Certificate or Participating Public Agency Registration, as applicable.
