### SCHOOL CLOSURE INFORMATION

It is the goal of Spokane Public Schools to keep schools open during snowy weather. However, safety is never compromised when reaching a decision about school closure or late starts. Prior to making decisions, district officials consult with the City of Spokane and Durham Bus services regarding road conditions and with school administrators, maintenance and custodial staff regarding school building, sidewalk and parking lot conditions. With this in mind, inclement weather may cause school schedules to be adjusted as follows:

- Bus delays – school operates on the regular schedule with buses running late
- 2 hour delay – school start is delayed 2 hours – elementary school would start at 10:30. Express childcare begins at 8:00 a.m.
- School closure – school is closed for the day and will be rescheduled during the school year on a designates weather make up day.

Parents are always encouraged to consider the conditions of their neighborhood and well-being of their students in deciding whether to keep their child home.
