
On another note, I wanted to provide a little information about two results-based computer programs to meet students right where they are in reading and math. Dreambox (mathematics) and Lexia (reading) learn from your child's successes and errors and adjusts the program to meet their individual needs. It is very important that our students are completing a minimum of 10 units in Lexia and 5 lessons in Dreambox a week to fully reach grade level standards by the end of the school year.

Students are completing lessons each week at school, but you can also support by providing time for your child to access these resources at home. To sign in to either program from home, go to <a href="https://clever.com/in/spokaneschools">https://clever.com/in/spokaneschools</a>. Their username is their last name + the last 4 digits of their SPS student Identification number + @sps81.org . For example, if I were a student, my username would be simmons###@sps81.org. And their password is their 8 digit birthdate (MMDDYYYY). I am excited to see how much our students continue to improve over the course of the year with expert classroom instruction, combined with the abovementioned online resources, as well as your support and guidance at home.
