

Immunization Requirement Change

In Washington State, the Tdap vaccine is required for school attendance in certain grades. The Tdap is a booster vaccine which continues to protect your child against the tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis diseases they were immunized against as a young child. As of August 1, 2020, the Tdap school requirement has changed to 7th grade to better align with the updated 2019 national immunization schedule (https://www. cdc.gov/vaccines/schedules/hcp/ imz/child-adolescent.html). In the past, the Tdap booster was required starting at 6th grade. For the 2021-22 school year, all students attending grades 7-12 must have had one dose of the Tdap vaccine. For students in 7th and 8th grade, the Tdap Vaccine must be given at or after age 10 to be accepted for school entry.

Reporting Student Illness

Attention Parents or Guardians, Please note the following symptoms:

- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fever of 100.4 or higher or a sense of having a fever
- Sore throat
- Chills
- New loss of taste or smell
- Muscle or body aches
- Nausea/vomiting/diarrhea
- Congestion/runny nose not related to seasonal allergies
- Unusual fatigue
- Headache

When your student has one of these

symptoms, they must test negative for Covid or be quarantined per *district guidelines*. To find out when your student can
