As always, thank you for all that you do to support our school community!

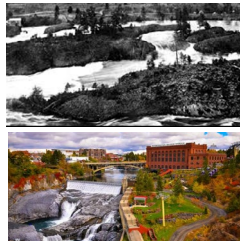
