Dear Families,

As you know, our students' safety is a primary concern for us at Hutton. We want our children to learn and grow in a secure and safe learning environment. In our district, Personal Safety is taught each year to students from kindergarten to 6th grade. This year Personal Safety will be taught in the month of October. Your child's teacher will be giving a series of short lessons centering on aspects of Personal Safety. These lessons include Internet Safety, along with maintaining safety with strangers and friends, understanding appropriate and inappropriate touch, saying "No!" to inappropriate touching, and identifying sources of help and support available to children. If you wish to see the Internet Safety information, just log on to www.NetSmartz.org. There are additional materials for parents and follow up materials for students. If you have any questions or would like to preview the Personal Safety curriculum materials, please contact our school counselor, Mark McCune at 354-3030. If you have concerns about your child's participation in Personal Safety, you have the right to have your child "opt out." Please know your request will be honored without embarrassment to your child. You can opt out by contacting the school office and requesting a Student Exclusion form



Reporting Student Illness


Attention Parents/Guardian, please
