Tips for Parents and Students: How to be a Successful Elementary Virtual Learner



- Read your assignment from your classroom and your teacher and check email daily
- Ask questions: Reach out to your teachers. They want to help
- Create a checklist to mark things done as you complete them
- Use numbers or highlighters to prioritize what order things should be done
- Plan for your day by scheduling when you will work on each assignment
- Set up a check-in routine with a parent or older sibling every hour or two to help you keep on track
- You might consider making a calendar of all assignments and due dates, you could even create a virtual calendar that student and parent have access to
- Create a workspace for the student, with supplies, lists, notebook paper, highlighters (like a home office). If a student is struggling to complete assignments, this could be in a public location or near parents. If there are siblings in the same home, set up different workstations so students do not pick up on each other's conversation
- Set up a routine that you follow daily, make it visual and public, do not procrastinate
- Take an occasional short break, take a walk to become more productive
- Use the mute button if there are noises coming from the house
- Refrain from using inappropriate language
- Be patient with the technology, sometimes the teacher will be having issues and sometimes your internet will have issues, so take a break for a few minutes, restart the computer, or call the school or the district for help
- Be kind to yourself. These times are hard. Some days are better than others. Give yourself and others some grace.
