Caring Corner

Stevens elementary is excited to pilot a new social emotional assessment tool called Bloomsights. Bloomsights is a digital assessment tool which looks at school climate and student well-being. It helps improve how staff understand and work to promote the well-being of students and a positive school climate. Students use Bloomsights to express how safe, engaged, connected, and supported they feel at school. Teachers use Bloomsights to better understand their social and emotional dynamics in the classroom in hopes of improving positive connections and relationships. Bloomsights helps students identify and process their emotions, learning preferences, and needs, gives students a voice in the classroom, reflect on the different types of relationships they have with their peers, and envision themselves as a part of a community.

With learning from home now part of life, many families have had to establish a new daily routine. If online school is new to you, you may not be sure how to structure a day of distance learning. One key to helping your student succeed in online school is establishing routines. Here are a few strategies successful online school families have used to create manageable routines: set a schedule and stick to it, don't confine learning to one place (take advantage of moving around when need be), give everything a place, schedule mealtimes, and prepare for the day ahead of time.
