

School Counselors are an integral part of students' daily educational environment and are partners in student achievement.

School Counselors in Spokane Public Schools are certified Master's Level educators in charge of implementing a comprehensive school counseling programs. They focus on the "whole child" with an emphasis on academic achievement, social/emotional learning and support, and career and college planning.

School Counselors provide:

- Short-term counseling discussing issues of a personal, social, or educational nature and referrals for long-term support like HEART and Behavioral Health.
- Group counseling where 4-6 students gather and discuss topics of special interest: anger management; conflict resolution; friendship/social skills; grief and loss; selfesteem; anxiety/worry; and study skills.
- Classroom meetings exploring life skills and monthly character traits.

Caring Corner



Stevens elementary is excited to pilot a new social emotional assessment tool called Bloomsights. Bloomsights is a digital assessment tool which looks at school climate and

student well-being. It helps improve how staff understand and work to promote the well-being of students and a positive school climate. Students use Bloomsights to express how safe, engaged, connected, and supported they feel at school. Teachers use Bloomsights to better understand their social and emotional dynamics in the classroom in hopes of improving positive connections and relationships. Bloomsights helps students identify and process their emotions, learning preferences, and needs, gives students a voice in the classroom, reflect on the different types of relationships they have with their peers, and envision themselves as a part of a community.

With learning from home now part of life, many families have had to establish a new daily routine. If online school is new to you, you may not be sure how to structure a day of distance learning. One key to helping your student succeed in online school is establishing routines. Here are a few strategies successful online school families have used to create manageable routines: set a schedule and stick to it, don't confine learning to one place (take advantage of moving around when need be), give everything a place, schedule mealtimes, and prepare for the day ahead of time.
