Including student voice and participation in our decision making and the actions we take is a best practice and a defining characteristic of high achieving middle schools. When we have student behavior concerns, engaging students to help us encourage and change behavior is powerful. Hearing from our students when they have concerns, interests, and solutions will make our Shaw Middle School experience better for students and staff alike.

This year, each Advisory provided names of students who would be good candidates for the Shaw Student Advisory Council (SAC). These students work closely with our ASB Officers and are willing to share their thinking and opinions. SAC students are encouraged to lead, be role models, and be a positive voice for their advisory,. Their leadership skills will grow through the SAC experiencem making future leadership opportunities in high school and comfortable.

Currently our SAC students and ASB are planning an assembly to launch our Speak Up initiative. Speak Up helps students and staff find their voice when they are victim or exposed to harassment, intimidation and/or bullying. Research tells us that when we don't speak up in these situations it isn't because we don't care, it is because we are not ready, equipped and practiced with what to say. What we will learn is how to speak up in ways that lead to a better school experience without becoming a target of making the situation worse.

Students and staff having the courage, skills, and willingness to speak up is part of the culture we are working hard to create and how we help each student recognize Shaw as <u>"Their School"</u>. While we work to achieve adaptive skills for the students graduating from our middle school ABLE program, our teachers and paraeducators are eager to meet incoming students as well. In the Peak team's English Language Arts classroom, we have had the pleasure of hosting Ms. Greene a Gonzaga University student teacher. Originally from Tacoma, Washington Greene is pursuing her dream to become a middle school teacher. She started her classroom observations in the fall and will be finishing up her student teaching experience in the beginning of May. She is a competitive athlete in track & field competing in the 800 meter. Greene currently holds Gonzaga's indoor record and is

currently holding 3rd place in outdoor—all while learning and doing her student teaching experience at Shaw.

When Gonzaga was drafted as a number one seed in this year's NCAA Division I men's basketball tournament, Ms. Greene saw an opportunity to bring the tournament's excitement into the classroom! Rather than have the tournament and brackets being a distraction, Ms. Greene embraced and capitalized on the excitement.

Students reviewed vocabulary from the novel, *The Giver*. Working in competitive teams, students shared their knowledge with one another and rushed to the ref. # **Celebrating Pacific Island Culture & Advisory**

Shaw Middle School has one of the most diverse student populations in the state of Washington. Our goal is to celebrate all of the cultures that come together to make Shaw great in the coming year. We have chosen to begin this celebration of culture with the Pacific Islands. In Spokane Public Schools, Pacific Islanders make up the largest percentage of our students that are learning English. This is also true at Shaw Middle School. During the month of April we are learning more about three distinct regions Pacific Islands: Micronesia, Melanesia and Polynesia.



Each week we are learning about the culture of these regions in our Social Studies and Advisory courses, starting with big questions such as, "What is culture?" We are playing music from each region in the Commons and students are sharing their life experiences including what they love about Pacific Island culture. This will culminate in a Convocation on April 29<sup>th</sup> showcasing Island Culture including traditions, story telling and song and dance.

Also our school year is winding down and this means we will be finishing our Social Emotional curriculum in our Advisory courses. Our curriculum, CharacterStrong has taught students about kindness, commitment, forgiveness, patience, respect, honesty, humility and selflessness throughout the year. The Sessions are designed to identify these traits and bring them to the surface and make them part of our school culture. The focus in the closing Sessions of Character-Strong will be Increasing Well-Being for 7<sup>th</sup> graders and Becoming School Leaders for 8<sup>th</sup> graders.

### Dear Shaw Family/Guardian:

State tests can provide important information about your student's skills in literacy, math, and science. Though last year was a particularly unusual school year, this fall students in grades 4-8 will take the Smarter Balanced Assessment.

All Shaw students will take the tests online. Our students will be taking the literacy, math, and eighth grade science assessments. Our school is scheduled to take the tests beginning May 9-13 literacy, May 16-20 math, and May 23-25 eighth grade science. All assessments will be given in the specific content classes.

We will be having students take the MAP assessment in literacy and math the week of June 6 in ELA and math classes.




### **Academic and Social Emotional Success at Shaw**

At Shaw we realize that every learner is different, and we strive to provide them with the skills and habits of success necessary to achieve their dreams, plans, and goals. To accomplish this, we are organized to meet the needs of all learners. We have strategies and supports that are used universally with every student, every day. We also have specialized supports for students who need more to be successful. Each of our students is a part of a team at Shaw. This means that your student along with a group of peers share six teachers throughout the day in their Math, Science, English, and History classes. This allows the students and teachers to get to know each other and grow their relationships and successes as learners. Shaw also has a dedicated team comprised of a cross section of staff members who meet weekly to address the needs of individuals or groups of students who need more than what is offered at the universal classroom level. This team analyzes pertinent data and information to pair resources and research-based interventions best suited to help students find success.

The results have been incredible, we have had an extraordinary year at Shaw! Our students are experiencing great aca-

demic success. At the conclusion of the first semester Shaw had 150 students earn VIP status. VIP is attained by students who are demonstrating the traits of high school readiness. These traits are earning A's or B's in classes, maintaining exemplary attendance, and exhibiting positive behavior in class and social settings. This academic success is paired with strong social emotional growth as well. Shaw is equitable in exclusionary discipline rates as a result. Each of our subgroups of student population's discipline rate is within 3% or less of the corresponding population (see graph below).
