Shaw VIP News

Over the course of the 2021-2022 school year your Shaw students established a dream of what they want their life to look like. They developed plans to ensure that dream unfolds for them and set and worked towards goals to help make their dream and plan a reality. Along the way they have been fiercely supported by a team of teachers and other school staff to help them succeed. The results have been tremendous. Requests for intervention were less than half of what they were for the 2019-2020 school year (the last full school year). Twenty-three of our 8th graders earned Double Platinum VIP status. This means they hit every academic and behavioral bench mark asked of them every quarter of their entire Shaw career. These students were celebrated at our Evening of Excellence which featured community members, the high school principals of their next schools, and Shaw staff who spoke about each student. During the last week of school Shaw will reward two hundred and ninety students who earned VIP status with a field day for all of our VIPs, a trip to Riverfront Park for our Silver and Gold VIPs, and a trip to Silverwood for our Platinum VIPs. Great job Vikings!

Shaw Families.

We are a proud Title I School. This is a federal designation that provides our school additional resources to improve student learning. We use our Title I funds to hire additional instructional staff, provide professional development opportunities for staff, purchase additional instructional materials, and engage the family community in events. We will be planning virtual family events and hopefully in-person in the future. Please view our Shaw website for more information.

At Shaw, we invite you to continue to find ways to partner with us in your student's education. One way to partner with us was to provide input on our Title I Parent Engagement Plan, our Title I Compact, and our School Improvement Plan which were emailed out to families and placed on the Shaw website home page. We appreciated your feedback. Currently, the revised documents are available on the website. Thank you, families, for supporting your students at Shaw Middle School.

Academic Celebrations

The Shaw mission is to prepare all Shaw students for academic and social successes in high school and beyond. This year our students have shown they are taking big steps in that direction with their academic achievements. Each of our academic departments and each team sets a goal, monitoring and supporting students so they can progress in their learning.

The Lexia and MATHia software programs have been used this year to give students additional support in their English and math classes. Lexia supplements classroom instruction in the development of literacy knowledge and skills, focusing on reading comprehension, word study, and grammar. MATHia units are aligned to the district curriculum with workspaces that build conceptual understanding or that allow students to demonstrate concept mastery.

Our English department has set Lexia goals for students completing units each quarter. Our general education, special education, and ELD students have all demonstrated gains in literacy proficiency as they have engaged with the Lexia program throughout the year. Shaw students' greatest progress was in the areas of word study and comprehension.

When the district publishes MATHia results, Shaw is always at or near the top. At the end of first semester, our students led all the middle schools in number of workspaces completed. An April competition had three of our math classes placing in the top ten of all middle school classes in the district. Research has found that students who complete 30 or more MATHia workspaces will be more successful in high school math courses, and current results indicate that most Shaw students are well beyond that important benchmark. The science and social studies departments have set goals that focus on students selecting evidence to support claims in their writing. Students are making gains in their ability to use this aspect of the writing process. Academics are supported by before- and after-school programming with more than 80% of Shaw students participating in these extended learning opportunities.

TRiO Talent Search

Hello Shaw! My name is Aubrieann Hale, and I am the TRiO Academic Advisor for Shaw. TRiO is a new grant-funded partnership with starting at Shaw. I provide programming for students to help them succeed and to learn about what their interests are, and how we can help them uncover their post-high school dreams. We have already been having a lot of fun. Our most recent trip was to "Hamilton", we had a great time watching the play and having lunch in downtown. We have an event this summer for you to go to the Northwest Museum of Arts Center's "DreamWorks Animation". Other events coming in the future are visits to college campuses, businesses and other places with the idea that the more they see and interact, the better idea they will have of where they want to go! I also provide one on-one support as well as interesting and fun workshops. Make sure you apply as we are currently screening for participants. This program is for 6-12th graders, so we can really get to know you for the long haul and be a part of discovering your future, and it's all FREE for your student.

Evening of Excellence


